### REVISED CALL FOR OFFERS OF PAPERS / PRESENTATIONS

The suggested main theme for this proposed meeting is ‘**Neoliberal Policies for Economic Development: Critical Review**’ as the focus of the presentations and discussion in the main morning session.

In the main morning Session (11.00 am to 12.30 noon) two keynote presentations are invited.

In the second session (1.30 to 3.00 pm) two research-based presentations are invited relating to aspects of international development.

The third session (3.30 to 4.00 pm) will be open to presentations by Doctoral research students focussing on aspects of international development more broadly.

Offers of presentations will be considered by Michele Battisti (the new Chair of the University of Glasgow Centre for Development Studies) and John Struthers (University of the West of Scotland).

The meeting is being organised by Mozammel Huq (University of Strathclyde), and Michael Tribe (Universities of Strathclyde and of Glasgow). **The revised deadline for receiving offers is now 31<sup>st</sup> March February 2021.** As of 5<sup>th</sup> March we have one firm offer, and we know that one further offer is in prospect for the first session. We are confident that other presentations can be agreed in order to make the meeting viable.

We are anxious to ensure that the selected presentations will be of a high quality presentations. The intention is that presentation slides and a pre-recorded Zoom introduction (of about 10 minutes) will be available for downloading before the online meeting (details for this will be available closer to the time).
