


Communications report

- Increased posting frequency has had a positive effect on all metrics measured
- From Dec 2021 posting frequency has doubled (+50 posts per month) which accounts for increased follower growth and engagement in early 2022
- Average engagement rate for NGOs is 0.02-0.09% - The DSA Twitter is significantly out performing that
- Not only are we are seeing a growing follower base, but an increasingly more diverse one too: e.g. recent follows inc: Italian Association of Development Economists, SANEM, Hegoa Institutua, Olumidel DOWU, AI4DA






Membership breakdown
